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### **Course overview / general description**

Discipline «Problems of migration and migration policy in the EU» post a systematic understanding of current approaches, principles and methods of studying the migration process, the trends of population migration in EU, about the features of collecting information about the spatial movement of the population, on the principles, objectives and measures of migration policy.

This discipline gives a wood analysis of the problem of migration in European countries. Students get social and political issues as migration of population. Also the legal field and focus attention of the international community on human rights issues, problems of illegal migration to the EU are provided.

### **Learning outcomes**

- To determine the substantive field of migration policy, to reveal the theoretical and methodological and conceptual interpretations of the concepts of "migration" and "migration policy" from positions of political science;
- To analyze the state, the nature and characteristics of the empirical base of migration process, to identify the main trends of migration in EU;
- To reveal the principles and instrumental basis of general management strategies of European immigration policy;
- To analyze the role and importance of quotas as a tool for selective integration of migration management;
- Describe the structure of subjects, the resource base of the strategic analysis of migration and migration policy of the Russian Federation in link of EU; analyze the possibility of regulating migration in its institutional, legal and regulatory components, identify and describe the priorities and perspectives of development of Russian migration policy.

### **Course contents**

Structure of course contents theoretical approaches to the analysis of migration movements and trends of internal and external migration in EU, the causes of migration movements, problems of integration and adaptation of migrants, the impact of migration on the socio-economic development and assessment methods, the foundations of migration policy and experience of its use in the different countries of the world. The focus of the course - the main theories to explain the patterns of migration. Particular attention is paid to date to the quality of migration data sources, methods of analysis and forecasting migratory movements.
